Impact on pupils' attainment:	Data showed that across key stage 2 there has been a significant rise in pupils working above ARE.
How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:	Appropriate equipment for breaktimes/lunchtimes. The new PE teaching scheme ensures there is sport in place should the employed specialists not be available. Every child receives 2 hours of P.E. as a minimum.
How the school will sustain the improvements:	A 2 year provision has been made with WNDSSP to ensure all the facilities and opportunities are available. Whole school staff training has been carried out and as well as specific training - Forest Schools, Dance, Athletics – Playground leaders.
